What to look for in a good devotional?

- One that focuses on a particular Bible verse or passage
- Encourages you with truth from God's Word
- If done with a family member, one that facilitates discussion of biblical truth with them.
- Devotional material should clearly show where in the scripture the material comes from so you can look it up for yourself.

For Kids:

Bible story devotionals are great for young children to be read to them by an adult. It exposes both of you to stories and truth from scripture. Many are on the market, but look inside it and read several familiar stories to be sure it is true to the scripture (Noah and the Ark, Jesus Healing the Blind Man, The Prodigal Son, etc.)
