

"make atonement" –  $k\hat{a}phar$  – to cover, to forgive, to explate, to reconcile "grain offering" –  $minch\hat{a}h$  – a donation; a sacrificial offering

1. A \_\_\_\_\_ Offering

This was done as an act or symbol of \_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ for God's provision.

- Romans 12:1
  - "worship" *latrěia* ministry, service to God
  - For the person who has given their life to Jesus and is a child of God, there is ALWAYS a \_\_\_\_\_\_ to \_\_\_\_\_.

2. A \_\_\_\_\_ Offering (1)

• \_\_\_\_\_: a valuable commodity in the region

- \_\_\_\_\_: very costly and pure; a symbol of richness and good times
- \_\_\_\_\_: a resin symbolizing holiness and righteousness
- \_\_\_\_\_: symbolized the covenant between God and Israel
- 3. A \_\_\_\_\_ Offering (2a)
  - It couldn't contain \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_.
    - Yeast *châmêts* to be leavened; also, to be grieved; often represented sin
    - 1 Corinthians 5:6-8, Galatians 5:9, Luke 12:1
  - This was the only offering that didn't involve the \_\_\_\_\_ of something.
- 4. A \_\_\_\_\_\_ Offering (2b-3)
  - Some of the offering was \_\_\_\_\_\_ like the burnt offering.
    - Acts 10:4
  - The rest of the grain offering went to the \_\_\_\_\_\_ for their use and was their primary source of daily food.
    - Romans 12:1-2
      - Jesus modeled this kind of complete surrender for us; *see* Ephesians 5:25-28.
