1. <u>Unlikely Unions</u> (1:1-1:3)
There are two unlikely unions here:
(A) Prophet to Prostitute
~ Hosea uses the word "" or similar words 19 times in this short book.
~ God did not tell Hosea just to talk to her, or minister to her, or even counsel her so that she
turns from her sinfulness; He said to go her, and Hosea
(B) Righteous God to Rebellious Man
~ "If Hosea's story cannot be real (because 'God could not ask a man to marry an unfaithful
woman'), then neither is the story of salvation real, because that is precisely what Christ has
done for us." – James Boice
2. <u>Unfortunate Designations</u> (1:4-1:11)
Not only did God tell Hosea who he was to marry, but God also told him what to name his kids and it
wasn't according to the usual custom.
(A) the firstborn son; his name means "scattered" or "God sows."
(B) the first daughter; her name means "no compassion."
(C) a second son; his name means "not my people."
3. <u>Unbelievable Reconciliations</u> (3:1-3:5)
(A) Prophet to Prostitute
~ God calls Hosea to go get his prostitute wife and even though she ha
left him and her kids to go back into her former life of prostitution.
~ In total, Hosea paid about pieces of silver for Gomer, the same price that was paid to
Judas to betray Jesus.
