

# Our Complicated Citizenship

1. An \_\_\_\_\_ Citizenship (Phil. 3:20-21)
  - First and foremost, those of us who have \_\_\_\_\_ to the lordship of Christ are citizens of \_\_\_\_\_.
  - We don't allow ourselves to be "\_\_\_\_\_ on earthly things", but that doesn't mean that we give absolutely no \_\_\_\_\_ to earthly things.
